Draft Master Plan Delhi 2041 has been published to solicit suggestions from the public for participatory and inclusive planning. The first Master Plan for Delhi was published in 1962 under the Delhi Development Act, 1957 (Act 61 Of 1957). This Act and the first Master Plan of capital city of a free and democratic India set the ball rolling for urban planning and framing of urban laws at the national level. This Master Plan also set the benchmarks for other towns to prepare the Master Plans, frame urban development control regulations and approach for detailed planning at Zonal Level. It became the most quoted document in urban planning academia and research circles. Master Plan Delhi , which has the regional context, therefore, is the most valued document of urban planning in India.

Planning for a giant living entity like Delhi, a global city second only to Tokyo, is the toughest task for Urban Planners. It is no child's play to produce a cohesive statutory document after intensive data collection and analysis, establishing their inter-relationships, interpretation and presentation. The easiest part is commenting on it.

The preparation of such a document requires inputs from experts for sustainable city planning which reflects the aspirations of the citizens. It should create a homogeneous entity out of disparate elements. It is a difficult task in view of the multitudes and intricacies involved.

ISPER has been established to assist the governments and their agencies. Therefore, this roundtable conference has been organized to discuss the contents of the Draft Master Plan and strengthen it aspect-wise, wherever, required.

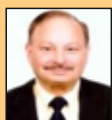

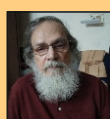
