About the Seminar

Indian society is diverse in terms of every aspect of social life, including social, cultural, linguistic, ethnic, religious, and so forth which also becomes a basis of diverse forms of inequalities and power relations. The colonial anthropologists and historians observed distinct features of Indian society and also a close connection between caste, tribe, and gender. The extensive documented research reveals that these three groups have been socially marginalized, suppressed and discriminated against in Indian society, historically. They have therefore lagged and underperformed on different measures of social and human development. Although the Indian constitution consists of certain laws and acts which protect these marginalized and vulnerable from the atrocities committed against them, the



ground reality is different and ideals of equality, liberty and fraternity remain aspirational.

With the rise of self-respect movements during different phases of history, affirmative Action policy of the Government and the herald of the 1980 led social network revolution several patterns in social, economic, political

milieu have been noticed among these three groups. Today, scheduled castes play a significant role in Indian politics. Likewise, the recent women reservation bill, which got approved in September, 2023 shows that the Indian political system recognises gender equality as a pillar of a just society. However, scheduled tribes do not hold the same level of political significance, barring few exceptions.

In light of this broad idea, this seminar will reflect upon the intricate relationship between the caste, tribe and gender in India. The seminar would provide rich perspectives through which the policies related to Caste, Tribes and Gender in India that have been crafted to address historical injustices and promote social equality in Indian society be scrutinized. The seminar organizing team extends an invitation to social scientists, students, activists, policy makers to be a part of the seminar through paper presentation on the following subthemes:

Subthemes:

- Intersectionalties of Caste, Tribe and Gender
- Caste, Tribe and Gender based violence
- Issues of Caste based Discrimination
- Issues of Tribal Marginalization
- Issues of Gender Discrimination, Disparity
- Empowerment and Participation
- Policies and legal frameworks to address the issues of caste, tribes and gender
- Impact of and effectiveness of Governments affirmative action policies

The above stated subthemes indicate the understanding of the potential debates within the confines of the theme of the seminar. The presenters may explore other multifaceted topics/issues under the broader theme of caste, tribe and gender in Indian society.
