INTRODUCTION

ASSM COLLEGE, MUKANDPUR

Amardeep Singh Shergill Memorial College, Mukandpur (SBS Nagar) was taken over by Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar on July 4, 2007 as a Constituent College with the mission to provide quality education to the rural youth. The University has established this institution as Rural Model College. Under the aegis of University, the college is running professional course like MCA and MBA.

The College was established in 1994 in the memory of Amardeep Singh Shergill, an illustrious student of London School of Economics who passed away in prime of his youth. He was the only son of late Mrs. Surinder Kaur and Mr. Gurcharan Singh Shergill, an NRI from England. Instead of getting subdued in grief, the parents decided to serve noble cause of spreading the light of knowledge amongst rural youth with the help of NRI associates.

The College is situated at Mukandpur which is a small town in District S.B.S Nagar. It is about 8 km from Banga, 20 km from Phagwara and 20 km from Phillaur and 20 km from SBS Nagar. The campus sprawls over 20 acres with an architecture that merges with the landscape. It has a magnificent triple storied building with open shelf library, which has more than 32,000 books, 40 journals/ magazines and leading newspapers. The library has an e-Book section. The students can view the educational CDs in the library. The College library provides facility of Internet and photocopy to students and faculty members. Latest equipments are employed as teaching aids. The College has Chemistry, Botany, Home Science, Child Care, Music (V), Physics, Dress Designing laboratories and smart class rooms. There is a separate Computer Science and I.T Block, which has six state of art Computer laboratories equipped with 150 computers and internet connectivity of 7mbps (1:1) through radio link. Equipped with modern teaching aid the department of commerce and business management disseminates essential skills of entrepreneurship through academic and professional courses. Keeping in view the deteriorating standard of English Language amongst rural youth an English language laboratory with Re-Net software imported from Finland has also been set up inside the College campus. There is a separate Seminar Hall with a sitting capacity of 170 persons. A Hostel for 80 girls is available with extended Internet facility in it.

Gymnasium with its latest imported machines is a cynosure of all the eyes. Sports facilities include a track of four hundred meter, playfields for Football, Hockey, Volleyball and Handball. Latest induction in the sport facilities is wrestling coaching which is provided free of cost to college students as well as to non students. A fleet of buses carries the girl students to College and back to their home. The beautiful open-air theatre helps our students to nurture their academic and cultural capabilities. To widen the horizons of the learners, seminars and extension lectures by eminent speakers are arranged in the College from time to time. Separate units of N.C.C, N.S.S, Youth Club and faculty/subject wise societies have been working to make our students disciplined and service oriented citizens. College is leading in academics in the area and also has achieved name and fame in cultural activities. Educational trips are arranged during the session. Apart from being a medium for entertainment these Educational trips cultivate team spirit, mutual adjustment and tolerance amongst the youth. Various cultural programmes including talent hunt and Amardeep Mela are organized annually.

SRSPM GURU NANAK DEV UNIVERSITY COLLEGE, NIARI

Vide Syndicate decision dated 29-12-2000, the college was taken over by Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, from a private trust and University started imparting instructions in Bachelor of Arts classes. The said decision of the Syndicate was duly approved by the senate of the University vide decision/ resolution dated 25-01-2003. Since then the College is a University College standing as a light house for the Dhar subdivision. Honorable Vice-chancellor Prof. A.S Brar is very keen to develop this institution as one of the best educational Colleges. He has been very kind to get the construction of four new classrooms completed and furnished them with sleek furniture.
